Dear Friends,

The beginning of April, this year, marks the beginning of Holy Week, the culmination of the previous five weeks of preparation that is Lent. During Holy Week we reenact the highs and lows of the key events in the last days of the



life of Jesus. We ride into Jerusalem on a donkey whilst the crowds gather and wave their palm branches and shout Hosanna. We gather around the Passover table as Jesus washes the feet of his disciples and shares with them the very first bread and wine. We sit and wait with Jesus in the garden as he prays to his Father one last time. Then we gather at the foot of the cross to watch as Jesus is put to death. On Holy Saturday we wait- as Jesus' disciples waited for the chance to serve the body of Jesus in the tomb, we wait. Then on Easter morning we gather and witness the empty tomb and celebrate our encounter with the risen Christ.

Each of these acts takes us deeper into the story and experience of Jesus and His disciples and each time we rehearse it we learn and experience something new. It also stands in somewhat stark contrast with the Easter celebrated by the world. As with Christmas where we wait for Christmas day to celebrate and keep going until February, the world will have begun their celebrations as early as November and some even before that.

The rest of society will be eating hot cross buns and munching on their chocolate eggs long before Easter Sunday dawns. I have learnt from bitter experience that waiting until Easter to buy your Easter eggs and chocolate means that you are more than likely to be limited in your choice- being left with only the most weird and wonderful and frankly disgusting combinations to choose from. And of course, by Easter Monday it is all gone, and the shelves will be full of something else- this year probably coronation flags and union flag decorated cakes.


This can make those of us who keep Easter feel disconnected from the culture in which we live. This disconnection is an increasingly familiar feeling. There have always been generational divides, but the fast-ever-changing technological world can make these divides seem deeper and wider. We recently watched the first Mission Impossible movie, filmed in 1996. At the time of release, we marvelled at the amazing tech: watches that could take a phone call, ear buds that fitted in your ears with no wires, phones that could track someone's every movement. Imagine that! Well- we don't need to as we use all of those things every day. What was pure fantasy just a few years ago has become our everyday reality.

When we feel disconnected from the culture around us it can be tempting to batten down the hatches and reject the changes, by doing this though, we risk pushing away connection and people. As society changes we have to hold firm to what is true and important but keep ourselves open to new opportunities, to seek for what is real and can enrich our lives.

Down country lanes and tracks

A week ago I went on a walk from Kelston on the outskirts of Bath on a nine mile circular walk which took me up to the Cotswold way and with views over to Bristol and sights of the Severn bridges. In that view was the famous Fry's Chocolate Factory at Keynsham which was built in 1923. Production gradually moved from the centre of Bristol and was completed in 1935.

After the first world war Cadbury Brothers undertook a merger with J.S Fry and Sons and set about building the factory with social facilities. Then It had rail links with Keysham and Somerdale station and at it's height had 5000 workforce.

I remember going on 3 trips to the Fry's Factory when walking from the station to the factory during the 1960's to see the manufacture of Fry's Chocolate Cream, Double Deckers, Dairy Milk, Crunchie Bars and during the summer selection boxes ready for Christmas and in the winter Easter eggs.

The work force were locally known as 'Chocolate Welders' and the Crunchie machine made over one million bars a day.

On our visits to the factory after the tour we would have tea in the canteen with sandwiches and cake and come away with a selection tin of chocolates.

Cadbury announced in 2007 that they would close the factory and it closed in 2011.

The factory has a new lease of life now with a Retirement village, Swimming pool, restaurant, shops and extra housing.

It brought back memories of the 60's to see the factory from the walk. I managed to finish the walk just before the rain came down sheltering in the Old Crown pub in Kelston.
