Life often brings the unexpected. For me, the next adventure will be leaving my North Somerset home of 20 years and moving to Swindon to start work as curate in the Stratton Team Ministry, after my ordination as Deacon in Bristol Cathedral on 30th June. I never thought I would be doing this! My husband Anthony is uprooting himself to accompany me – and, though he doesn't know it yet, our dog Archie is



coming too (in case you're interested, he's a bichon frisé/shih tzu cross). Anthony and I have three adult children, with the youngest still at university. My elderly Mum lives in Bristol.

I still feel surprised to find myself on this particular path – and yet it feels like the right thing to be doing, and the sense I have of being called by God to become a priest continues. This sense began to grow in late 2019 and I started training (or 'formation') at Sarum College in Salisbury in August 2022. All Sarum ministry students study largely from home, following online modules, tutorials over Zoom and attending several residential weekends each year. I soon found that I much prefer reading real, paper books to those on a screen! While I finish at Sarum in June, my training will not be over – as in any area, there is always more to learn and experience – but will continue through the next three to four years of curacy.

My British parents met singing in the choir of St Michael's Church, Paris, and continued living and working in France, where my two sisters and brother and I grew up and went to school – so part of me still feels French! I learned the piano from a young age and also play the clarinet and accordion and have loved leading sung worship in churches over the years. I have done various admin jobs from freight forwarding to working for local charities.

I look forward to learning and discovering more as I worship, live and work alongside Elveen and all of you in the Team churches. As the song goes, we are pilgrims on a journey, and companions on the road; we are here to help each other walk the mile and bear the load. I am excited to find out how that journey has been for you so far, to join you for this next chapter of our journeys of life and faith

and to find out with you where God might be leading next. See you soon!

St Margaret's Church building work.


We started looking at alterations to St Margaret's Church four years ago when we received a bequest from the Late John Cornwall to progress the planning and design of the tower changes, to rehang the bells and create a space to have a disabled toilet and kitchen facility along with the finishing of the retiling of the south roof and porch which needed to be done. As time went on the costs started to rise that when we finally got permission of a faculty to proceed. The building committee decided to have a two phased project due to funds. The roof work to be delayed and to apply for the Heritage Lottery fund for a grant to complete the roof with Roger Smith carrying out the application.

Work has been progressing on the tower. The chimney has been removed also the old ceiling of the ringing chamber and electrical work to allow for the new work to progress.

The 8 Bells were removed and will be retuned, cleaned and refurbished from Taylors and Son of Loughborough. 11 Pews have been recycled using the wood to build the staircase, Kitchen and screens.

The next stage will be to start to put in the Mezzanine floor and new bell chamber ceiling.

The building committee hoped and prayed that we would be successful with our application to the Heritage Lottery fund so that the roof could be completed following the tower work.






Bumps and Babes St Margaret's Swindon
