Dear Church Family

What a month it's been! God has been good and the sun shone for both of our bulb planting events at St Margaret's and St Mary Magdalene. There are photos on Facebook showing the happy smiling faces of our volunteers. Two families joined us at St Margaret's and I hadn't seen the children since I baptised them so it was wonderful that they came to support this event. We were joined by a family at St Mary Magdalene and our Counsellor Matthew Vallender. Refreshments were enjoyed at both events and my deepest thanks goes to those who organised and helped.

On 26th October we had an Elizabethan Event at St Leonard's, this was to celebrate the restoration of the Elizabeth I Amorial. We had our choir, a string quartet, hand bells and Rob played an organ piece. Geoff played the harpsichord as well as accompanying the choir. There were over 65 people who came and the event was a great success. There were even a few Elizabethan dressed ladies serving cakes during our intermission. Mike gave an interesting talk on the history of the Amorial, its historical significance and the restoration process. The Amorial is now on display permanently placed to the right corner of the church near the Vicar's stall. If you haven't yet seen it please do take the time to visit and have a look. Our Amorial is only one of 12 that we know of and ours is rarer still, being 3D and the dragon depicted is green. My deepest thanks goes to all who took part, those that played, sang, rang, served and baked. Thank you.



Still to come is our murder mystery event which I hope will be well supported. Even the actors don't know until the night of the performance who dunnit! I love a murder mystery so I will be there looking for clues I hope you will be too.

Looking ahead in November we have our Remembrance services on the 9th. On the 15th November our Methodist brothers and sisters will be holding their annual Tear Fund Big Quiz, Stratton Team always field a couple of teams but the more the merrier and it is for a good cause.

This year we decided to hold our annual Rosemary Service on a Team Sunday. This gives all our church family across the team a chance to attend to remember their loved ones. It was decided to hold it during the usual morning slot as feedback from some of evening services is that many don't like coming out in the dark. Our Rosemary service is a chance to remember loved ones whether they died recently or many years ago. Names that have been given to us will be read out as part of the service and there will be an opportunity to light a candle.

This is also the time of year when our Funeral Directors hold memorial services and it is a privilege to welcome back Pearce Memorial Services to our church.



Our Advent service this year is, like the Rosmary Service, a team service at 10am at St Leonard's. We have traditional readings and carols that are specific to Advent. We as Christians know that Christmas begins at the birth of our Lord Jesus and what happens before that is about preparing for that great occasion during our Advent season. Traditionally it would have been a time of prayer and fasting much like Lent though this discipline has faded out of our tradition in the West. However we can use this time to prepare for our Lord. You don't have to fast but maybe take some time to focus on the true meaning of the season. It's an opportunity to reconnect again more deeply in prayer and perhaps spend more time reading our Bibles, it's surprising how the Gospels differ when telling the Christmas story.

You will see that we have had, over this year, a variety of events. The purpose of these events is to invite people who don't normally come to church or have much contact with Christians. Most people have no idea what churches are like inside, only what they see on television or film. By the way have you noticed whenever there is a vicar in the show, they are either putting out the hymn books or putting them away? Anyone would think we live there! Putting on events is our way of showing a friendly, welcoming Christian face, a way of making the building seem less scary or intimidating. The hope is that they may then think we are 'all right' and maybe they may even reach out to us in a time of need. Alongside our events having a missional focus, they are also valuable fundraising opportunities for us. It would be lovely to make our church more accessible with a permanent ramp for example. Not only could we make the church more welcoming we could also perhaps get a children and families worker to help us with our children's ministry.

The possibilities are endless if we have the funds available. We don't keep all the money we raise either, we have charities that St Margaret's support each year, International, National and local, it's the local charities that we give 10% to of anything we make. Our events team are always open to hearing ideas of what we could put on. We want to hold events that appeal to different, demographics and ages so that we our helping build our community engagement at Stratton. Our hope is that what we learn at St Margaret's will help our other churches in our team. An example of this is we gave some of our bulbs to St Mary Magdalene. Many people across Stratton Team are willing to help out at any of our church's events as could be seen at St Leonard's Amorial celebration.

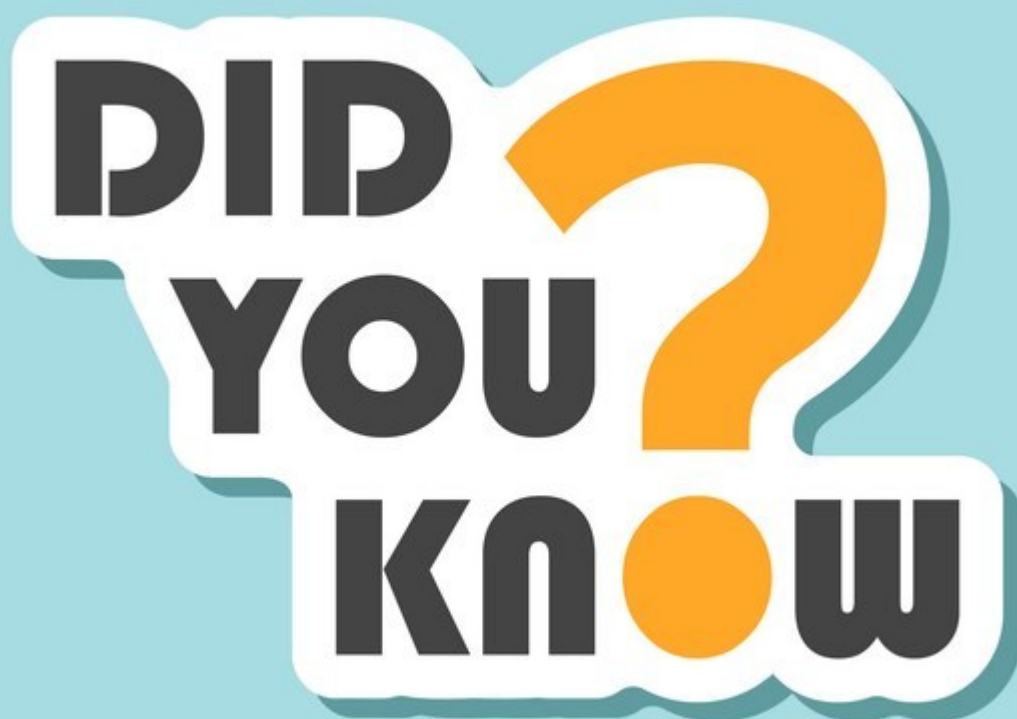

Did you know?

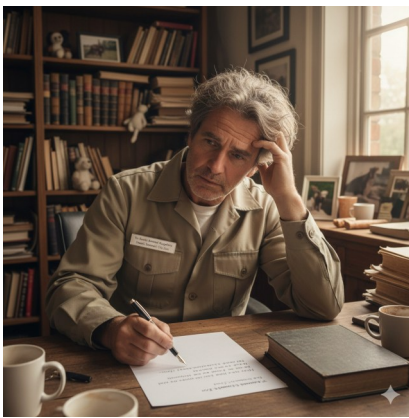

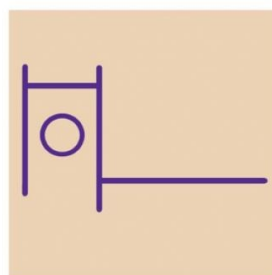
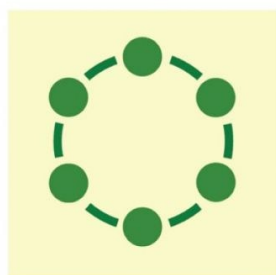
You may be aware that many charities and organisations are struggling at this time, this includes churches.

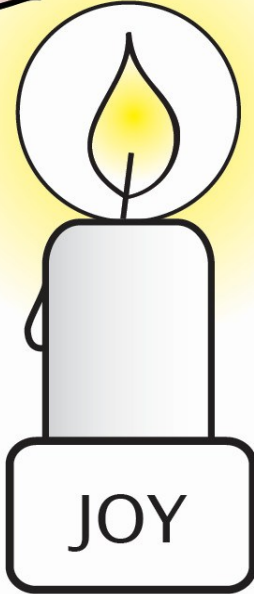


LIGHT IN THE DARKNESS

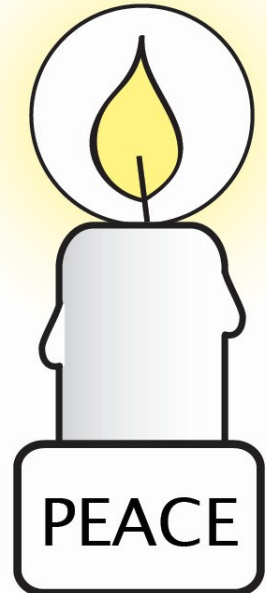

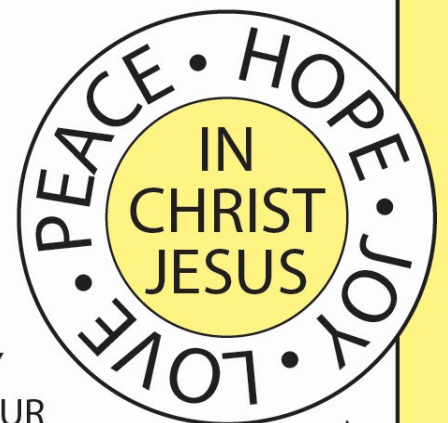
