Thoughts from the Rectory for October 2023

Dear Friends,

There are many things to commend about getting in the car and taking a break somewhere in our wonderful British Isles, but being stuck in traffic on the motorway is not one of them!

I'm sure you all have stories of sitting in jams, sandwiched between lorries for what seems like hours with 'roadworks ahead' signs all around and miles and miles of cones. And when you finally reach the roadworks the site seems deserted with no sign of active construction going on at all - diggers seemingly abandoned, and no sign of life!

Apologies to all construction workers reading at this point – I do understand that you need time off too!.



On a recent trip to we got caught up in roadworks both on the motorway and on the the main road and a sign caught my eye that I had never seen before. It read '*We are working out of sight, so you may not see us*'. I wondered if this had been created in response to all those grumbles from the general public about just such experiences.

Construction work on motorways is incredibly complex. What we see and experience once the work is completed in the new intersections, widened motorways, new bridges etc. is the result of the keen minds and skills of a myriad of people from all sorts of disciplines from planners to architects, from civil engineers to groundworkers, often working out of sight, always working to a masterplan but all **we** experience is the upheaval as change takes place- and all this takes time.

Change often causes upheaval, always takes time, but may bring with it significant benefits.

My experience of seeing God at work is not dissimilar to my experience of motorway roadworks. Life can be hugely frustrating. We try to find a way through the obstacles that get in the way of what we want to do or where we want to be, or we get 'stuck in traffic' in a rut that we can't see a way out of. Perhaps we look around for those who can help us and we see no-one.

But God is working, often working hardest in the most difficult and challenging times we encounter. God may be working out of sight, and you may not see him, but he is there, patiently waiting for each one of us to accept that changing our ways, turning towards him and asking to be part of his masterplan is the only way to bring about the change that leads to life in all its fulness.

Perhaps the motorway sign that God writes might say this: 'We are working out of sight so you may not see us, but you will definitely know where we have been'.

Perhaps it's time to make a few changes in your life and seek the God who loves you and is working to change your heart and bring about a better future for you— even if he seems to be out of sight!

Down country lane and tracks East of Winchester -- The Meon Valley

The Meon Valley is a quiet beautiful area in rural Hampshire with lovely walking routes passing through the South Downs Way and the Monarchs Way. It is not until you visit you become aware of the many great things that contribute to the surrounding area.



On our walk we started at West Meon passing through the graveyard of St John the Evangelist Church which was rebuilt in 1846 and designed by a young George Gilbert Scott age 21 who went on to design the St Pancras Hotel, Westminster Abbey and the Albert Memorial among many famous buildings. The walk heads for Beacon Hill which as the name suggests is the site of a historic Beacon. With the views from here you can see Southampton, The Solent and the Isle of Wight over 20 miles away. From here we picked up the old Basingstoke to Portsmouth railway track which is now a walking route. This railway closed to passengers in 1955 and goods in 1962. We are making our way to Old Winchester Hill which is on the South Downs Way which runs from Winchester to Eastbourne. Old Winchester Hill is an Iron Age Hill fort which has burial mounds and was fortified with ditches and wooden ramparts with equal spectacular view of the Solent and a good place to stop for a picnic lunch.

It was then on to the South Downs Way through a magical walking hollow which is an ancient path through a tunnel of trees. These pathways were often routes for smugglers taking their goods secretly through the countryside. The path would gradually be worn down and the hedges would form a bank on each side until the pathway became a tunnel of greenery.

On our journey back towards West Meon we stopped for coffee at the Meon Springs Fly Fishing Lake, which as the name suggest is located near Chalk Springs, the Chalk River Meon also runs through the valley. It was then on to West Meon passing the old inn Thomas Lord. Thomas Lord was born in 1755 and was one of the first cricketers (a bowler) and was a founding member of the MCC Marylebone Cricket Club and played for Middlesex. Thomas Lord took a lease on land in St Johns Wood in London and was referred to as Lords Cricket Ground which is now Lords the home of Cricket.

Thomas Lord retired to West Meon and his son also called Thomas Lord was also a first class Cricketer a batsman, Thomas Lord Senior died in West Meon in 1832 and is buried in the Churchyard where we started our walk.

Often you uncover a great deal of history if you look a bit deeper into where you ramble. Who would have thought in this quite rural valley, you would find so many famous people who left their mark on the Meon Valley.

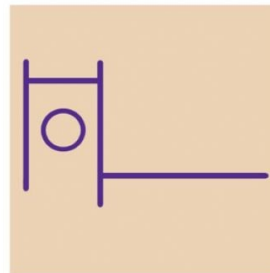
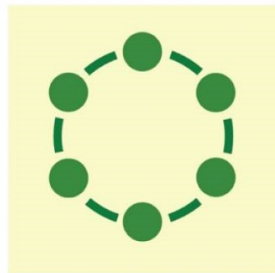
You may be aware that many charities and organisations are struggling at this time, this includes churches.
