Dear Church Family

We come into September, in the Anglican church, into the Season of Creation and it starts on September 1st. This is a time when we renew our relationship with our Creator God and all His creation, through celebration and appreciation of the gifts of nature and the beauty of our world. We consider how God created the World and continues to sustain everything in it. We also think about how mankind, being tasked by God to 'steward' the earth, was told to look after it and nurture it, and we consider what sort of a job we are doing.

Often, it is easy to look around our beautiful countryside around Swindon and overlook the fact that there is something seriously wrong with the climate and the weather. This year we have had some warnings of rather more extreme weather ahead for us and for our children. An extreme heat wave in early August, followed by torrential rain in mid-late August. Whether or not you believe that climate change is man-made or simply science/sun spots or natural changes in our weather, what is now indisputable is that the climate is changing, and these changes will be negative for most of the planet.

We have seen through other incidents this year (wasn't going to mention the virus this month) that we are all connected as a planet and that decisions we make locally or nationally will affect the entire planet sooner or later. We can't take a purely local view on climate change.

We have been encouraged to eat less and move more for our own health and to help us resist the virus (sorry, second mention) but in reality, consuming less and walking or biking instead of using the car benefits the planet as well as our waistlines and our mental health.

Recycling and eating local produce is another way of looking after our health and being kind to the planet. If you are already doing any of this then you are blessing your own wellbeing and the planet with these new ways of living.

At Stratton Team we are looking at our Eco status and are in the process of joining the Anglican Churches initiatives to greater sustainability.

Never underestimate how even the smallest of changes to lifestyle can have an impact.

So as we move into this new season here is the short prayer for Creation to pray at home.

Holy God, earth and air and water are your creation,
and every living thing belongs to you:

have mercy on us as climate change confronts us.

Give us the will and the courage to simplify the way we live,
to reduce the energy we use,
to share the resources you provide,
and to bear the cost of change.

Forgive our past mistakes
and send us your Spirit,
with wisdom in present controversies
and vision for the future to which you call us
in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

Old Forgotten Words

Times change and word meanings alter or the words themselves disappear.

The Bible itself is not immune from such evolution. When did any of us last glean in grain fields as did Ruth? It was a practice that only disappeared from this country in the last century where local people could collect, by hand, grain that had been missed by the harvesters.

We read of a famine in the land when Elijah stayed with a poor widow and her son and yet throughout the famine there was sufficient oil in the widow's cruse or oil jar to make bread for the three of them. Faith played its part but when did any of us use a cruse, it has passed into history.

The faith of a Roman Centurion saved his sick daughter. He was an officer in charge of 80 soldiers and not as widely believed of 100. The basic army unit was a Contubernium of 8 men for that was the size of a goatskin tent that one mule could carry and, as to be seen in many architectural sites in this country, the size of a barrack room was always for 8 men. 10 of these units, 80 men was a Century and 6 Centuries was a Cohort. So once again the word Centurion has disappeared into the mists of time.

The Baobab tree, even today throughout tropical areas, is a most useful commodity. A thirsty traveller can tap it for a plentiful supply of water and it also has medicinal qualities. In Biblical times it was known as the tree of life so could this be what Jesus was alluding to when He spoke of the bread of life?

So, do keep exploring the Bible for in it are countless words that are no longer in use today and they may provide routes into learning even more about our Christian Faith.

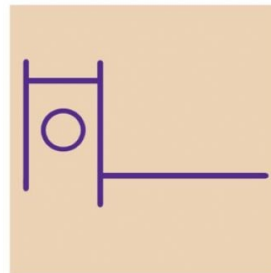
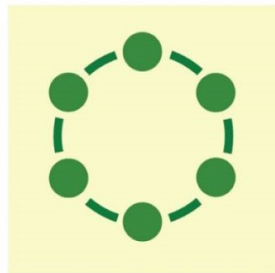
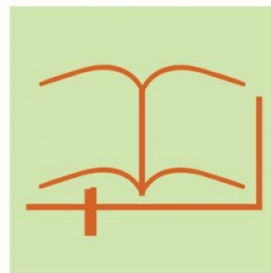
You may be aware that many charities and organisations are struggling at this time, this includes churches.
